

SYMPTOMATIC VS ASYMPTOMATIC CAROTID ARTERY STENOSIS. A clear separation between symptomatic and asymptomatic carotid artery stenosis is critical.

Carotid stenosis is a narrowing or constriction of the inner surface of the carotid artery, usually caused by atherosclerosis

Conclusions. Among patients with symptomatic or asymptomatic carotid stenosis, the risk of the composite primary outcome of stroke, myocardial infarction, or death.
